PURPOSE AND DESCRIPTION

The State Charter Schools Foundation of Georgia (SCSF) is seeking quotes from qualified vendors to provide design and website services for the Georgia Strategic Charter School Growth Initiative, a partnership between the SCSF, State Charter Schools Commission of Georgia (SCSC – state agency), and the Georgia Charter Schools Association (GCSA – nonprofit).

Work will commence as soon as possible with the goal of finalizing design standards and launching a website by early summer 2022. Some design services may be ongoing through September 2023. The selected vendor will work with members of the partner organizations.

This engagement includes the following components:

Design Services

- Graphic design, including images suitable for print and electronic materials and promotional items
- Brand identity, including a logo and style guide incorporating the colors from the three organizations

Website Design

The vendor will create a website in WordPress on a platform that is user friendly for updates to be made by organization staff.

QUOTE REQUIREMENTS

Quotes must include the following elements:

- Proposal to provide requested services
- Quote for services, including hourly rate for additional services
- Proposed timeline
- Information about and qualifications of the firm and/or individuals proposing to provide the requested services

PROCUREMENT STANDARDS

In all cases, the SCSF will employ sound practices in procurement activities and will endeavor to procure the most cost-effective products and services to further the mission of the SCSF. When making procurement decisions, SCSF staff and board members will consider product/service quality, price, effectiveness, and convenience. In addition, preference will be given to Georgia-based vendors,

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suppliers, and manufacturers and/or those who are approved to do business in Georgia per Georgia Code Section 20-2-520. This contract will be paid with federal GEER II grant funds.

The Georgia Strategic Charter School Growth Initiative is a partnership between the State Charter Schools Foundation of Georgia, State Charter Schools Commission of Georgia, and the Georgia Charter Schools Association. The goals of the initiative are to educate Georgians about charter schools and their charter school options and to promote the creation and replication of high-quality charter schools in underserved communities. The initiative is funded by GEER II grant funds.
